**PROJECT 150 celebrates its 4th anniversary
with event to benefit homeless high school students**

LAS VEGAS – Members of the public are invited to join Project 150, a local nonprofit that helps homeless, displaced and disadvantaged high students, in celebrating its 4th anniversary of service in partnership with the Clark County School District, volunteers and supporters.

WHY: There are more than 2,500 homeless high school students in the Las Vegas Valley, many of whom don't have basic necessities such as socks, underwear, shoes, clothing and the school supplies needed to keep up in class. Proceeds from the celebration will benefit the students Project 150 serves, providing such resources at 44 local high schools and at its volunteer center at 3600 N. Rancho Drive in Las Vegas.
